Addiction impacts every segment of society. Substance use disorders destroy families, jobs and lives every day.

The good news is that addiction is treatable, and you can help. The outlook for addiction-oriented jobs is excellent.

The number of addictions treatment and recovery services jobs is predicted to increase as our current workforce retires and additional jobs are created to meet the demand for treatment services. In 2005, an estimated 22.2 million persons aged 12 or older were classified with substance dependence or abuse. Today’s workforce is faced with increasingly complex cases requiring a high degree of skill and professional training. By 2010, the call for addictions treatment professionals and licensed treatment staff with graduate-level degrees is expected to increase by 35 percent.
